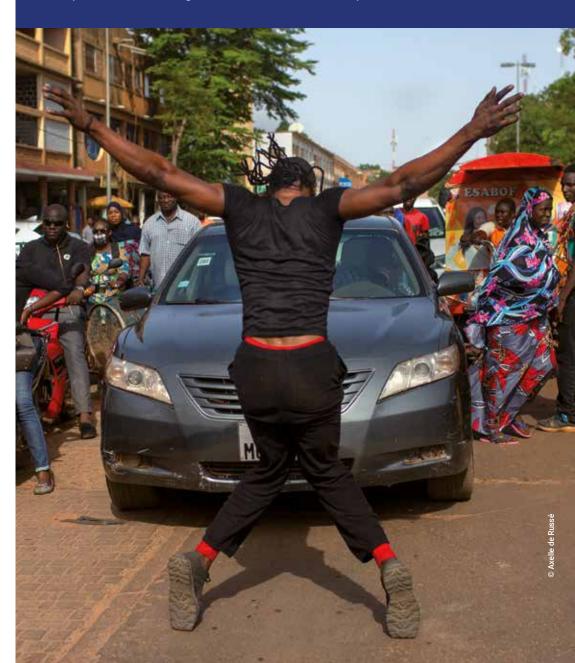
Metis promotes a better integration of arts and culture in the developmental process. Too often treated separately, arts and development would do better to strengthen and enrich each other.

The arts, an essential means of driving development

DEVELOPMENT, A TECHNICAL APPROACH

Development projects aim to improve living conditions in countries expressing this need. Their implementation relies above all on the technical dimension required for their effectiveness. A diverse network of public and private stakeholders is mobilized for these projects, working at both local and international levels.

However, until now, this sector has devoted little attention to the emotional aspect, a fundamental component of any humanist project. Yet who could deny that projects introducing new ways of living can also bring about an emotional adventure?

THE ARTS, HUMANITY AMPLIFIED

Through painting, music, dance, theater and poetry, the arts connect us to our senses and the emotional world. They are sources of emotional resonance. The arts create connections that transcend social, cultural, religious and political differences. They expose what is hidden, raise awareness, criticize, challenge and build. The arts enrich our individual and collective intelligence.

Since the dawn of time, the arts have been present in the daily lives of human societies. Just think of the cave paintings in Lascaux in the south of France, or the role of painting in ancient Egypt, or of African ritual dances. Arts and development have always fueled and fed another.

Assessments and feedback from the field reveal that development projects are still struggling to achieve their objectives and obtain the results needed to address growing challenges, and the time has come for us to innovate in our ways of thinking and acting.

AFD: MAIN OPERATOR OF INCLUSIVE FRENCH INVESTMENT IN SUPPORT OF DEVELOPMENT

Created in 1941, Agence Française de Développement (AFD) now works in 115 countries. The projects it supports target the sectors of energy, urban development, agricultural development, preservation of the environment, health, and education. AFD is one of the world's leading donors of public funds. Based on the findings outlined above, and strengthened by France's rich cultural and artistic experience, AFD has decided to create a unique initiative through the Metis Fund.

METIS: PURSUING THE MUTUAL ENRICHMENT OF THE ARTS, CULTURE AND DEVELOPMENT

Metis proposes to open new spaces for dialogue. This financial framework allows artists in countries where AFD is active to invest in development projects supported by AFD. Metis targets artists who want to take part in these projects, who, while recognizing the technical aspects, can provide the additional emotional aspects that will render them all the more effective.

- Strengthening the impacts of development projects
- Improving local ownership of these projects
- Stimulating the involvement of all stakeholders
- Helping donors, including AFD, become more attentive to the talent present in countries where they intervene

A concrete example: Metis supports Mauritian "artivist" Kan Chan Kin

CONTEXT

AFD actively intervenes to support governments of countries in the Indian Ocean, companies, NGOs, and research centers to preserve marine ecosystems, which are sources of crucial socio-economic services for the people living in these countries.

THE PROJECT

Supported by Metis, Kan Chan Kin will:

- Produce musical instruments using plastic waste
- Organize awareness-raising workshops
- Involve a wide range of stakeholders from Mauritius in his creations
- · Exhibit his work
- Produce a concert highlighting these instruments created by upcycling

EXPECTED IMPACTS

- Enrichment stemming from the meetings between:
- the artist and scientists, academic experts on plastic pollution
- the artist and various Mauritian stakeholders involved in waste management
- An emotional response to plastic pollution in the ocean among diverse audiences invited to the workshop, exhibitions and Kan's concerts
- Increased awareness among stakeholders who have been in contact with Kan and his productions with the aim of improving buying and consumption behaviors, and the management of plastic waste





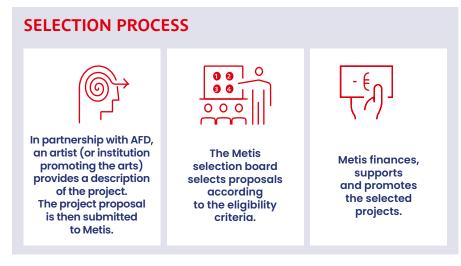

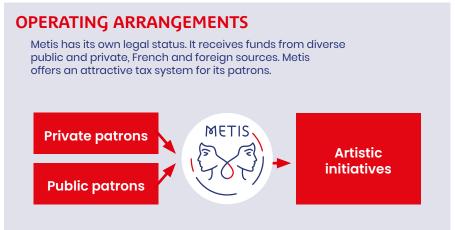
