t the heart of AFD Group research are inequalities and efforts to reduce them, the environmental transition, management of shared resources and economic diagnoses of countries where AFD operates. The results of our research can be of use not only to decision-makers, but also to the public at large, while also highlighting the pertinence of AFD Group's operational and strategic decisions. To achieve the objectives set by the Group, the research underscores the need to work more closely with stakeholders in developing countries, at both the national and international levels.

Conducted by multi-disciplinary teams, our research allows us to co-design development trajectories with our partners and to identify public policies best suited to the contexts and geographies in question.

This 2020 report lays out the main trends in AFD Group activity in terms of geographical distribution, volume, priority areas, and value-added products. This inaugural annual edition illustrates the distinct position that research holds in the Group, notably around five flagship programs.

AFD Group's strategy for studies and research

The AFD Group's strategy for studies and research is in line with the priorities of its Strategic Orientation Plan (SOP). Divided into five flagship programs, it emphasizes public policy dialog and research in developing countries.

- To increase our cooperation with research partners in developing countries.






Amounts devoted to studies and research by region






In 2020, 212 studies and research projects were identified, amounting to €29.2 million, which is up from 2019 (€16.5 million committed). Mainly focused on the African continent, the studies and research funded relate to climate, healthcare and inequalities. Most of them involve partners working in countries or territories where AFD Group operates. In addition, they are in line with the commitments made by the Group as part of its five-year strategy.

Focus on Africa



THE SAHEL is a top priority for our research work



In line with AFD Group's geographic priorities, studies devoted to Africa's challenges increased significantly in 2020. Inequalities and healthcare, climate and fragility were the main topics of these studies. Several of these research programs were carried out through the Savoirs Sahel project, whose main goal was to identify and strengthen Sahelian stakeholders involved in knowledge production.

Supporting research in developing countries

he expertise and innovation produced locally enable us to address the specific sustainable development issues of the countries concerned as closely as possible and contribute to defining their public policies. Nevertheless, research is underfunded in most of the countries where we operate: if researchers and research spaces exist, they are generally isolated, not very visible, and not well connected to the public debate and decision-makers.

The Group supports and assists research in developing countries in various ways:


- by systematically involving teams from developing countries in the research it finances

Rethinking international funding for African research, a key issue


African research is still poorly represented globally. A policy paper, published in March 2020, describes its characteristics and challenges, the procedures and implications of the international aid that funds research in Africa, as well as the tensions tied to strategic choices around aid. The paper proposes steps that donors and policymakers can take to put in place measurement, evaluation, and incentive systems, and build a coalition of stakeholders in this area.

Covid-19,

healthcare challenges to be studied

Several studies and research papers were launched in 2020 to document the healthcare challenges posed by the Covid-19 pandemic around a variety of questions: how are hospitals preparing to deal with Covid-19? In Ivory Coast, how can rumors and misinformation circulating on social networks be an obstacle to testing? What are the consequences of Covid-19 on social cohesion in the French Overseas Departments? How can healthcare systems in Africa better prepare for health crises?

Our leading projects

GEMMES

The program aims to model environmental transition trajectories and to understand the interactions between the economy and socio-ecological ramifications (as regards agriculture, climatology or energy for example). GEMMES contributes to public policy dialog on measures that can contribute to these transitions in partner countries.

Facility on Inequality



The EU-AFD Research Facility on Inequality is a program funded by the European Union and coordinated by AFD. Its objective is to improve knowledge on socio-economic inequalities and to contribute to the development of public policies that are most likely to reduce them.

Savoirs Sahel



The project's goals are to identify and support initiatives, think tanks and opinion leaders, and to promote learning in communities, networking and public debate in the Sahel of the future.

Commons

Since 2015, the Commons research program has been observing original approaches to shared governance in different policy fields. It contributes to discussions on public action by examining the role of citizens. Based on distributed usage rights, it goes beyond sole ownership, especially in the field of knowledge-based goods.

Economic analysis

These analyses focus on understanding the growth models of the target countries, assessing the quality of their public finances, the stability of their financial systems, and the potential vulnerabilities of their balance of payments.

ESGAP



The ESGAP project provides a diagnosis of the state of natural capital using science-based measures of sustainability. Tested in Kenya, Vietnam and New Caledonia, the ESGAP highlights gaps between the existing environment and its optimum sustainable state, and proposes ways to monitor and manage natural resources

Public policy dialog

At AFD Group, research is positioned at the intersection between the academic world and the world of decision-makers in order to contribute to public policy dialogs and to public debate.

AFD Group has agreed on a preferential dialog on public policies with five countries: Ivory Coast (2017), Tunisia (2018), Morocco (2019), Mali (2019) and Lebanon (2020).

A dedicated governance structure has been set up around jointly defined research programs involving local and international researchers to debate the results of the research and identify public policy recommendations.

The African Economy 2020

For the first time in 2020, AFD Group presented new analyses on the major economic and social issues affecting the African continent in the "Repères" collection published by La Découverte. The 2020 edition, the first in the series, presented macroeconomic trends in Africa and its regions, and took a multidisciplinary look at major structural issues, both continental and country-specific (urbanization, migration, and industrialization).
