


To address the great challenges of the 21st century and the re-examination of the principles of the sustainable development goals (SDGs), the Paris Dialogue brings together seven international organizations and some thirty international, **European and French** institutions based in Paris around a common objective: to make Paris an innovative platform for exchanges, where different areas of expertise and perspectives are channeled towards concrete and coordinated actions for sustainable science and finance.



A PLATFORM OF ACTORS COMMITTED TO MAKE PARIS THE INTERNATIONAL LABORATORY FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT **SOLUTIONS**

Established by AFD, IEA, ICC, CEB, OECD, OIF, and UNESCO in 2023, the Paris Dialogue initiative is the result of a shared observation: international, European, and French institutions must cooperate differently to address the complex and systemic challenges threatening multilateralism and the SDGs.

While the Sevilla Conference (FFD4) marked a key milestone in rebuilding financing for sustainable development, the Paris Dialogue offers a space for synergies and solutions

where the key intellectual, financial, technical, cultural, and diplomatic expertise of Paris-based international institutions come together and address the socioeconomic, environmental, and democratic emergencies of our century.

More than 30 institutions have already joined this initiative. Together, they are designing concrete, replicable projects aligned with the SDGs - in a spirit of shared learning, amplified impact, and transparency.

The Paris Dialogue builds on the momentum of the Sevilla Conference by implementing:

- A dedicated Sevilla Platform for Action initiative, entitled "Paris Dialogue, a coalition for innovation in support of financing sustainable development" and the participation of its members in more than a quarter of the Platform's total initiatives.
- Additional co-developed deliverables aligned with the SDGs.
- A joint presence at thematic conferences and international forums (on AI, culture, sport, health, etc.).
- Coordination with major international bodies and coalitions (FiCS, 4P, COP30, G7).

Objective: to link innovation, cooperation, and impact on the ground in support of the sustainable development agenda.



The Paris Dialogue functions as a platform for innovation in support of a renewed multilateralism that promotes international Sustainability- and Solidarity-driven Investments (SSI). Its 2024-2025 shared work program is structured around four major priorities.



Financing sustainable development

- Reform the international financial system to make it fairer, more transparent, and impact-focused.
- Jointly mobilize public, private, and multilateral funds.



Education & culture: drivers of digital and environmental transitions

- Promote more inclusive, modern, and innovative educational and cultural systems.
- Support knowledge as a lever for transformation.



Connecting science, innovation, and entrepreneurship

- Foster dialogue between scientific research, investment choices, and public policies through innovation.
- Promote responsible innovation driven by the youth, local governments, and stakeholders in the Global South.

Sustainable AI Kit (AFD-OECD)

Global Sport Impact Fund (AFD-UNESCO)

NEXT STEPS


