#### AFD group in the Atlantic Ocean

AFD's Regional Directorate in the Atlantic Ocean (DROA) embodies the Group's presence as close to the field as possible and promotes strategic convergence and operational synergies between the various entities to best support customers and partners.

Based in Fort-de-France, Martinique, DROA runs a network of six locations (Guadeloupe, French Guyana, Martinique, Haiti, Dominican Republic and Suriname, also covering Guyana). DROA also operates on the island of Saint-Pierre and Miguelon, near Canada.











#### REGIONAL CHALLENGES

The Atlantic Ocean region extends from the Guyana plateau to the Caribbean arc, a vast geographical perimeter with diverse socio-economic contexts. The countries and territories of the region have in common, however, the immense challenge of fighting climate change and adapting fragile areas to its effects. The main development challenges for the region include managing natural disasters and limiting inter-territorial negative externalities, such as marine litter and the spread of communicable diseases. The Group works to share expertise in the renewable energy sector, coastal erosion management and public health. Another central mission is to promote the French talents of overseas departments and communities to the states of the region. Pooling resources through inter-territorial cooperation is essential to meet these challenges, while adapting to local specificities. The Group's regional strategy aims to strengthen the resilience and sustainability of territories while optimizing available resources and skills.
